Let me introduce you to Princess Lace! While not exactly “lace making”, I consider it more correctly called “lace assembly.” Easier than it appears, Princess lace employs a set of a particular style of cotton tapes, offering beautiful visual texture. By making a lappet in class we will learn, step-by-step, how to set up a tape lace project, manipulate the tapes, appliqué onto net, use filling stitches, to create and execute something beautiful (and useful!). With many shared samples and examples, your eye will come to recognize this old style of lace as you look at vintage works. With much flexibility, Princess lace works particularly well for costume and clothing, as well as household “fancies,” because it is easy to make a custom size and shape. Collar? Sleeve? Skirt panel? Veil? Engageantes? Yes to all! Familiarity with needle and thread is the only prerequisite.

KIT: includes all materials and limited printed materials.

BRING: Small scissors and straight pins.

While stitching by grandma’s knee at age 4, I developed a lifelong passion for needlework. I pursued it through my college career, volunteered at a number of museums, wrote magazine articles, delivered lectures, and have taught over 27 years. Specializing in “vintage” fine hand sewing techniques, with particular interest in costuming and embellishment, it remains a passion.

My teaching philosophy is one that endeavors to enlighten students to new materials and techniques, encouraging them to add to their own personal repertoire. I like to teach technique as well as educate the eye to recognize both past uses and future possibilities of such materials and techniques. My personal affinity is for the “past”, reflecting a period style, but I do, however, appreciate and encourage each persons’ own vision of needlework and thoroughly enjoy each individual creative process.
