The Nautilus Cockade is a perennial favorite because you will gain the knowledge to transform flat ribbons into three dimensional nautilus shells that can be varied in countless different ways giving you every opportunity to display or wear your ingenuity. In this class you will learn how to make a vintage style Nautilus Shell Cockade and also how to give them a modern twist.

The Nautilus Cockade can be used as a pocket to hold your notions on a chatelaine; turned into a brooch; used as a millenary flower on a new or vintage hat; attached to a crazy quilt, purse, headband or other sewing project; or an ornament for a Christmas tree! You will be most familiar with cockades on military hats and cloche hats and dresses in the 1920's.
